**Notice of proposed application for Development Consent Order to construct,  
operate and decommission the Thurrock Flexible Generation Plant, Tilbury Marshes,  
Street, London, E18 7LD (hereinafter referred to as the Project). The Secretary of State for Business, Energy and  
Industrial Strategy (the "Secretary") has issued a Development Consent Order ("DCO") under section 37 of the Planning Act 2008  
(the "Act") to authorise the construction, operation and decommissioning of a gas fired flexible  
generation plant and battery storage facility (the "Project").**

**2. The Project will include reciprocating gas engines, batteries, and associated electrical and control  
equipment, including access roads and a gas pipeline connection to the gas national  
transmission system will be developed. The proposed export connection will be via underground  
cables to the immediately adjacent National Grid Tilbury Substation. TPL has been established by  
Statoil Energy Limited to develop the Project.**

**3. The main development site for the Project covers an area of approximately 18 hectares and is  
located on the Tilbury Marshes, just west of the existing Tilbury Batteries.**

**4. The proposed DCO would, among other things, grant planning permission and**

- Reciprocating gas engines with total net electrical output totalling up to 600 MW;**
- Gas import and export infrastructure with a total capacity of up to 800 MW;**
- Gas and electricity connections, access roads and minor public highway widening for delivery of large loads;**
- Designation of replacement common land (exchange land) and possible creation of habitat for  
protected species translocation;**

**If required, the permanent and/or temporary compulsory acquisition of land and/or rights over land  
for the Project:**

**Thurrock Power Limited (Thurrock Power, a Statoil Energy Group Company, proposes to develop  
a flexible generation plant an area north of Tilbury in the Borough of Thurrock (the Project). The flexible  
generation plant will provide up to 800 megawatts of electric generation capacity and will be connected  
to the National Grid. The proposed connection will be via underground  
cables to the immediately adjacent National Grid Tilbury Substation. Subject to planning permission being  
granted and financial viability, the flexible generation plant could enter commercial operation towards the end of 2023.**

**This notice explains more about the Project and provides information about where a more  
detailed explanation of the proposed consultation with the local community can be accessed.**

**The flexible generation plant will comprise reciprocating gas engines, batteries, and associated electrical and control  
equipment, including access roads and a gas pipeline connection to the gas national  
transmission system will be developed. The proposed connection to the gas national  
transmission system will be developed via underground cables to the immediately adjacent National Grid Tilbury Substation. Subject to planning permission being  
granted and financial viability, the flexible generation plant could enter commercial operation towards the end of 2023.**

**The proposed development will be designed to operate for at least 35 years, after which ongoing  
operations and maintenance conditions will be reviewed. If it is not appropriate to continue operating after this  
time, one or both legal options for decommissioning will be commenced.**

**The proposed development is a Non Major Infrastructure Project under the Planning Act 2008,  
which means that a Development Consent Order (DCO) is required to decide, control, and manage the  
development. Due to the nature and size of the Project, Thurrock Power is undergoing an Environmental Impact  
Assessment (EIA) and the Project is therefore classified as an EIA development. The EIA will consider  
all potential impacts, both positive and negative, of the Project including air quality, noise, visual and  
complaints, ecology, landscape, archaeology and heritage, and socio-economics.**

**The DCO application will be prepared by the Planning Inspectors who will make a recommendation to the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy. The final  
decision on whether to grant the application will be made by the Secretary of State.**

**Formal consultation with local people, businesses and other organisations is an essential part of  
the DCO application process and will help influence the final design of the Project. Only after all  
comments and responses have been considered will the Project design be finalised and the application  
for DCO to regulate the project will be submitted.**

**The Government's policies in relation to Nationally Significant Infrastructure Projects are set out  
in National Policy Statements (NPSs). NPS EN-1 (Energy) states that: "gas will continue to play an  
important role in the electricity sector – providing vital flexibility to support an increasing amount of  
low-carbon generation and to maintain security of supply." As the need for this type of development  
has been established by national policy, the principle of developing flexible generation is not a matter  
of planning permission.**

**Thurrock Power has prepared a Statement of Community Consultation (SoCC), which sets out how

# Cash windfall will be a boost for communities' local parks

COMMUNITY leaders at Hardie Park in Stanford-le-Hope have won a grant of close to £200,000 to be invested in their future and those of five of five other parks in the borough.

The volunteers, known as Friends of Hardie Park, took the way in a partnership with Thurrock Council to apply for cash from charitable foundation NESTA, the Big Lottery Fund and the Heritage Lottery Fund.

The volunteers say they are behind the 'Redesigning Parks' initiative which aims to help those with creative and innovative ideas for running public spaces and plans to help them thrive.

Parks that have been awarded funding have all demonstrated exceptional potential for changing the way the park space is used and managed, with NESTA and its partners praising them for "putting communities at the heart of ideas to make parks more enjoyable and vibrant".

The Friends of Hardie Park have been trailblazers in community involvement in Thurrock, where local organisations are stepping up to the plate to run parks which Thurrock Council had effectively abandoned.

At Hardie Park, the grant of £184,155 will be shared with Bonnygate Park in South Ockendon, Aveley Recreation Park, Tilbury's Daisy Field, Grays Beach and Gobions Park in East Tilbury.

Community engagement has been behind the revival of interest in local parks.

Hardie Park led the way but not for long. It has been followed by the Friends of Bonnygate Park who have been volunteering at Grays Beach with a new cafe project has been funded as a huge success.

Recently residents in Aveley

didn't know which parks other than Hardie Park were involved. A statement from their communications team said: "We haven't included the name of the parks as we understand the sites under discussion. It will be fine - we don't have the details on which ones at this stage - but we will provide an update at a later date."

However, the Thurrock Independent's rudimentary research involving a quick walk found which parks will benefit.

Rob Groves, chief executive officer of Friends of Hardie Park, said: "We are delighted with the award. It is recognition of the work we have achieved to date in transforming and making the used park into a thriving public space with a community cafe for all to enjoy."

"The five chosen parks are at various stages of transformation and each will work with us and NESTA to benefit as they receive this funding."

Different groups of volunteers will take varied approaches to the management of the management of their parks.

"A package of learning and support will be created over the year to help the parks help NESTA in order to spread the approach to other areas. It's our opportunity to ensure our parks with the management skills to ensure sustainability."
